MATERIALS AT A GLANCE

2 mm cotton: cream 38 yd, rust 9 yd,
burnt orange 3 yd

40 mm wood ring x1

Beads: olive 10 mm x6, jasper 8 mm x2,

wood 8 mm x3 + 12 mm x2, brass rings x2

Seed beads 4 mm x2 (eyes)

Dried flower micro-bundle

Board, pins, needle, glue, wire brush

Finished: 18–24 in adjustable, 5.5 in pendant

BUILD ORDER

#	Section	Time
1	Mount H1+H2 V, 16 A cords	20 m
2	Beaded lattice bands (both)	2.5–3 h
3	V transition diamond	15 m
4	Cavandoli fox head + crown	2–2.5 h
5	Chevron tail	45 m
6	Ring wrap + body + paws	45 m
7	Drop diamond & point	30 m
8	Straps, slider, tassels	45 m

KNOT ABBREVIATIONS

LH — Lark's Head: fold, loop over, pull through

SK — Square Knot: L over, R over, mirror

DCH — Diagonal Clove Hitch: 2 hitches over angled filler

VCH — Vertical Clove Hitch: weaver hitches each warp (color work)

WK — Wrap Knot: 4–6 wraps, end through bottom loop

OK — Overhand: bead stops & tassel ends

TOP 5 MISTAKES TO AVOID

- 1 Loose DCH fillers — keep them drum-taut or the diamond windows go soft and the beads wander.
- 2 Carrying the idle cavandoli color across the face front — always drop it behind the work at each change.
- 3 Mismatched band lengths — count windows and SK rows per side before joining the straps; recount at the V.
- 4 Wrapping the ring loosely — pack every pass with a thumbnail so no wood shows and the tail hides clean.
- 5 Trimming fringe before brushing — brush, steam, comb, then cut once for a crisp edge.

A	Collar lattice	16	60 in
B1	Fox warps (cream)	4	40 in
B2	Weaver cream / B3 rust	1+1	90 / 100 in
B4	Burnt-orange gradient	1	60 in
C	Tail (rust)	6	30 in
D	Ring wrap	2	50 in
E	Drop diamond	6	24 in
F	Adjusters	2	30 in
G	Tassel fill	12	8 in
H	Holding cords	2	48 in

Cut everything 3–4 in longer than listed.

BEAD ORDER (strap → V, each side)

Olive 10 → Jasper 8 → Wood 8 → Olive 10;

brass ring between windows 2–3; wood 8 at V point.
